In colonial Virginia, a poll tax or capitation tax was assessed on free white males, African American slaves, and Native American servants (both male and female), all age sixteen or older. Owners and masters paid the taxes levied on their slaves and servants. Few tithable lists are extant.

The members of the council conducted the first English election in the colony, choosing Edward Maria Wingfield as their president in May 1607. John Smith reported later that the Virginia Company gave the council full responsibility for implementing justice in the colony.
