If judges treated economic rights as they do other civil rights, Scalia warned in a 1984 lecture, "we [might] find ourselves burdened with judicially prescribed economic liberties that are worse than the pre-existing economic bondage." Such judicial reasoning, he argued, could (for instance) end up in a "constitutionally prescribed" right to some set minimum wage.
