Lesson: Teaching Non-Fiction Labels

I brought my students to the carpet and said, "Today we are going to learn about an important text feature called labels. When we read nonfiction, the author will label a picture or photo so the reader

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knows what that is a picture of and/or can see the different parts of the object. This helps the reader to understand both the picture and the text better. I am going to read a nonfiction book now and we are going to talk about the labels in this book."

Nonfiction Text Features - Alston Ridge

Nonfiction text features are the aspects of text that make certain words stand out in some way. The text features either highlight part of the text as

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important or help increase understanding of the text. When a child is able to identify and use nonfiction text features, they become readers who understand more of what they are reading.

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1. Tells the name of the text feature
 2. Tells the purpose of the text feature
 3. Gives an example of the text feature.
